Highlights

BANGKOK: Fascinating mixture of modern buildings and spectacular traditional Thai palaces and temples.
KANCHANABURI: On the "Death Railway" close to the River Kwai bridge. Visit the world's tallest Buddsist monument and a floating market en route.
AYUTHAYA: Old capital of Thailand; a beautiful World Heritage Site.
SUKHOTHAI: Another World Heritage site home to many of Thailand's most beautiful shrines.
CHIANG RAI: View beautiful murals in a famous shrine, river trip to tribal village.
CHIANG MAI: Meo hill tribe village visiting and elephant trek
YANGON: (Rangoon) Myanmar's largest city; the waterfront area contains fine examples of British colonial architecture. The 2500 year old 98m golden Shwedagon Paya Stupa is a must see.
PROME: 5th century Pyu civilization archaeological site of Thiri-ya-kittiya, picturesque Hmawza site.
THAYETMYO: Pleasant colonial market town, horse and cart tour.
MINHLA FORTS: Two Italian built forts built to keep the British (unsuccessfully) at bay. Fine views.
MAGWE: Myat-thalon Pagoda, built with solid gold bricks!
SALE: Beautifully carved teak monasteries, colonial style houses. Climb or ride WWII jeeps to the top of Tan-chi-taung mnt. spectacular sunset views.
PAGAN: As spectacular as Angkor, Pagan boasts 4400 12th century temples.
YANDABO: Small but interesting rural village specializing in pot making. Site of the Pandaw School.
MANDALAY: Great view from Mandalay Hill, Gold leaf covered giant Buddha at Mahamuni, Shwe Nan Daw Kyaung teak monastery.
SIEM REAP/ANGKOR: 3 days to view incomparable Angkor Wat and the surrounding canals and temple complexes.
BATTAMBANG: Fine French colonial architecture. The Phnom Sampeau caves a major Khmer Rouge killing site, pretty local villages.
